



COMMUNITY FORUM

Councillor Reports

CIr Matthew Norris:

Advised all the Electrical Vehicle charging stations being installed at no cost to Council.

Will advise when the EMP feedback extension is confirmed.

Q. What is happening with the Wharf Road Boat Ramp rebuild grant application?

A. Has been mentioned to the acting CEO of Council awaiting response from State Government (noted that the community has been advised this should have been received by the end of March – transport NSW)

Clr Norris will take this on notice and advise

Cir Selena Clancy:

Clr Clancy confirmed that a Dune Care Group will be formed, and that Peter Swanson of Council will be the co-ordinator.

Removal of the sand at the beach – disappointing but awaiting grant variation approval.

Flood debris clean up – again disappointing for the

Discussion took place regarding whether a permit to burn would be approved – some agreed with this approach while others did not want to see burning.

Swimming Pool hours extension – this will be considered for next season.

CMP - feedback received.

Mayor Patricia White:

Pool hours are considered in Council's operating plans, and the Forum should give feedback to Council now regarding the community wish to have the pool available for the swimming season during school holidays - Secretary to provide feedback to Council.

Council have been advised by Department of Local Government that all of Council's Strategic Plans from 1/7/2025 must link to Council budgets to show that items can be funded.

Community Infrastructure Strategic Plan lists \$5.1bn in assets and will list those to be sold and im-

The Coastal Management Programs - Lower Shoalhaven River and others will now go to the May meeting of Council for endorsement.

There was lengthy discussion at the meeting regarding the CMP and Mayor White advised that the Entrance Management Plan and other flooding elements put forward to the CMP would not be included in the CMP but should be included in the Floodplain Risk Management Plans which are being developed from the various flood studies. The Mayor has met with South Coast MP Liza Butler to clarify the requirements and how actions from the CMP and other feedback on flood mitigation drains and other infrastructure which relates to flooding should be documented and actioned. A clarification letter from Liza Butler is expected and will be passed on to the community and Shoalhaven Heads Estuary Task Force. Dredging will be covered by the Flood Plans and Mayor White noted that there are two sources of funding for this action. The community members noted the need for community involvement in the Northern Floodplain Risk Management Committee and that the Shoalhaven Heads Estuary Task Force should be represented.

Discussion on the permit to remove the mangrove

seedlings - agreed by consensus that Council to be requested to apply for an extension of the permit for 5 years.

A mowing schedule for reserves mowed by Council is being activated on the Council website.

Native Botanic Garden - Tom Korevaar

Working Bees continue apace, with our 20 park care volunteers participating in 2 to 3 per week. Attention to safe work and good OH&S practices are receiving more detailed attention.

We recently invested \$3,000 to fabricate additional metal benches for our plant nursery, which is at the heart of our plant propagation work.

Shoalhaven Heads Estuary Task Force - Phil Guy

Phil noted there was meeting on 12th March with a packed agenda and very little information was provided by Council representatives.

Phil commented on the work done by the members to give constructive feedback to the various issues for the CMP and it is now apparent that the flood committee will be the forum for entrance and flooding issues.

Golf Club

The club are improving the entrance to the car park and the drainage, and the car park will be closed for two weeks from 7th April.

At the recent AGM it was revealed that the club made a profit for the year of \$69k which is an excellent result for the club.

The greens are looking fantastic and while the recycled water is not great for the greens due to a high pH and sodium levels the recent rains have been excellent.

Jerry Bailey Oval toilet

The toilet has been reported by Guido for leakage through the water facility.

Sand at Beach

Discussion on the excess sand at the beach. Guido suggested that the RFS water hoses may assist the return of the sand to the beach once the Council has removed the excess.

Potholes

There are several large potholes around the village on the edges of the parking areas, one opposite Bangalay has been there for over 6 months and is very deep.

Shopping Centre Traffic

Traffic around the shopping centres is causing some concern and a follow up with Council will be made to see if any solutions can be implemented.

Proactive Ranger

Compliment to Council ranger Jonno Wright who was noted as a very proactive person when issues are noticed.

Stormwater Drains

Phil Guy noted that the storm water drains around the village required maintenance to ensure effective drainage of water - Council will be advised.

Safer Roads

It was reported that the road between Shoalhaven Heads and Gerroa requires line marking to ensure safety - Council will be informed.





Your vote can help shape the future — but only if you know what you're voting for.

The table below compares where the major parties and your local candidates stand on key issues that affect our daily lives, our rights, and our environment. It's based on what they've said, what they've promised, and what experts and watchdogs have said about their policies.

It doesn't cover every topic. But it focuses on issues where the differences matter — like climate action, integrity in politics, healthcare, housing, and respect for science. We've added notes to explain each of the issues.

Use it as a starting point. If something here surprises you, look it up (using a reliable resource). Ask your candidate where they stand. And most of all — vote for your values.

1 - Climate targets (2035 etc)

Australia is experiencing escalating climate disasters—floods, fires, and rising costs. Achieving net zero by 2050 is insufficient; experts stress the need for significant emissions reductions by 2035.

The Greens and Independent Kate Dezarnaulds advocate for science-based 2035 targets. Labor plans to set one by September 2025. The Coalition opposes this and has considered withdrawing from the Paris Agreement. Andrew Constance, once a climate advocate, now aligns with the Coalition's stance.

Pacific leaders urge Australia to lead on climate. The Heads has faced eight floods this decade. Retreating from climate commitments signals a lack of seriousness. The science and stakes are unequivocal.

2 - Renewable energy vs nuclear

The Coalition proposes seven nuclear reactors by 2040. However, CSIRO and AEMO indicate renewables with storage are more cost-effective and quicker to deploy.

Nuclear projects often face delays and budget overruns, exemplified by the Vogtle plant in the US exceeding its budget by \$35 billion and the last two reactors ran over schedule by nearly 13 years.

Analysts predict the Coalition's plan could increase household energy bills by \$665 annually. Nuclear energy also demands substantial water resources, posing challenges in drought-prone areas and risking safety.

While solar and wind technologies are advancing in recyclability, nuclear waste remains hazardous for millennia

Australia's abundant solar and wind resources make renewables a more prudent choice.

3 - Trust in experts

Australia's scientific institutions—CSIRO, BoM, AEMO—provide critical, evidence-based guidance. Disregarding their advice undermines informed policymaking.

Peter Dutton dismissed CSIRO's nuclear cost assessments. Coalition members have questioned BoM's climate data and disseminated vaccine misinformation.

In contrast, Labor, the Greens, and Kate Dezarnaulds uphold the importance of science-driven policies.

Ignoring expert advice leads to increased risks and inefficiencies.

4 - Political integrity

Australians expect leaders to prioritize public interest. This necessitates robust laws, transparency, and accountability.

The Coalition has historically resisted integrity reforms and delayed establishing a corruption commission. Labor instituted one in 2023. The Greens and independents like Kate Dezarnaulds advocate for stricter regulations.

The continuation of these reforms hinges on the forthcoming election outcomes.

5 - Policy consistency

Effective leadership balances adaptability with consistency. Frequent policy reversals erode public trust.

Peter Dutton has shifted positions on taxes, migration, emissions, and public service cuts without clear explanations. Andrew Constance has similarly reversed his stance on climate policies.

Conversely, Labor and the Greens maintain consistent policy directions. Kate Dezarnaulds offers transparent, value-driven positions.

Voters deserve clarity and reliability from leaders.

6 - Women in leadership

Inclusive leadership yields better outcomes. Yet, women remain under-represented, particularly in parties opposing structural reforms.

Parties with fewer women often lack comprehensive policies on reproductive rights, care work, and workplace protections.

Leaders like Kate Dezarnaulds exemplify electorates valuing equity and diverse representation.

7 - Cost of living - causes & solutions

Inflation peaked in 2022 but has since returned to target levels. The Coalition continues to claim it's escalating.

Key contributors include corporate price gouging, especially in essential sectors. The Coalition attributes rising costs to migration. When viewed over the decade, average net migration hasn't dramatically changed. It dropped during COVID and was offset by increases in the following years. Labor and the Greens focus on addressing profiteering and unfair pricing.

Data shows migration has minimal long-term impact on inflation. Effective solutions should target actual cost drivers.

8 - Housing affordability

Home ownership is increasingly unattainable. Rents are soaring, and vacancies are scarce.

Core issues include insufficient affordable housing, planning delays, investor tax incentives, and weak tenant protections. Migration is not a significant factor.

Labor's housing initiatives offer incremental progress. The Greens propose substantial public housing investments and rent controls. The Coalition's superannuation-for-housing plan may exacerbate price inflation.

Kate Dezarnaulds supports equitable policies and evidence-based local solutions.

9 - Public service delivery

Public servants are essential for delivering critical services. Reductions in their numbers compromise service quality.

Peter Dutton proposed eliminating 41,000 public service positions, later suggesting attrition. Previous outsourcing weakened service delivery. Labor is reversing these trends. The Greens and Kate Dezarnaulds advocate for reinvestment in public services.

Undermining public services adversely affects all citizens, particularly the vulnerable.

10 - Rural and regional support

Regional communities face unique challenges requiring tailored solutions.

The Coalition pledges significant funding but has

a mixed track record, including opposing renewable projects and underfunding essential programs.

Labor, the Greens, and Kate Dezarnaulds focus on sustainable regional investment and climate resilience. Effective support necessitates consistent follow-through.

Rights, access, and equity

11 - Affordable healthcare

Bulk billing rates have declined below 70%. Labor has increased incentives and established Urgent Care Clinics. The Greens and Kate Dezarnaulds support enhanced public health funding. The Coalition favours increased private sector involvement.

In 2014, as Health Minister, Peter Dutton expressed concerns about the sustainability of Medicare, stating "Too many people are getting free services under Medicare."

12 - Reproductive rights

Labor, the Greens, and Kate Dezarnaulds support reproductive autonomy. The Coalition has opposed expanding access, including decriminalization efforts.

13 - Refugees and asylum seekers

The Coalition endorses offshore detention. Labor has ended temporary protection visas but maintains turnbacks. The Greens and Kate Dezarnaulds advocate for humane and efficient processing.

14 - HECS indexation & student debt

The Greens propose abolishing student debt. Labor has capped indexation. The Coalition maintains a market-oriented approach.

15 - Support for arts and media

Labor introduced the "Revive" arts plan and restored funding. The Greens support stable arts investment. The Coalition previously reduced funding and lacks a current policy as of writing.

16 - LGBTQIA+ rights

Labor, the Greens, and Kate Dezarnaulds support inclusivity and anti-discrimination measures. The Coalition has a mixed record, with instances of opposing inclusive policies.

Support for local issues

The future management of the Shoalhaven River entrance has become a key issue in this election, with both major party candidates making public statements in support of the Heads community.

Andrew Constance, Liberal candidate for Gilmore, said:

"I am aware that the Entrance Management Policy for Shoalhaven Heads is currently under review.

The Heads community should be listened to in relation to both the channel and the river mouth. All too often agencies have not responded to community needs as required

If elected on May 3, I will work across all levels of government locally and with the relevant agencies on this important local issue. I am a strong supporter of the Heads Community and will always assist where I

Fiona Phillips, Labor incumbent for Gilmore, said:

"People in Shoalhaven Heads feel like they've been let down by Council and I don't blame them for feeling that way.

I think the community has legitimate concerns about the management of the river entrance, and I'll be writing to Council to ask them to take another look at this. I understand there are complex environmental factors here, but surely Council can come up with some solutions that aren't just more of the same."

Both candidates have acknowledged community frustration and expressed willingness to support a better outcome for Shoalhaven Heads.

What matters most is up to you

This election is about more than politics — it's about the kind of future we want. From climate action to healthcare, housing, and honesty in government, your vote helps shape what happens next. Make it count. On May 3, vote for the values you want to see reflected.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR FROM REPOWER SHOALHAVEN

Most locals will know Repower Shoalhaven — the not-for-profit behind the solar panels on the Golf Club, the Bowling Club, and even the large-scale solar farm in Nowra. Since 2013, they've helped install over 5MW of clean energy in the region.

They've always kept out of politics, but with the election coming up, they've decided to speak up. Here's the letter they sent us:

Dear Readers,

Given the stark choices in the upcoming Federal election, Repower Shoalhaven cannot remain politically neutral.

2025 Election Response We can no longer remain silent.

Repower Shoalhaven Incorporated has, since its inception in 2013, worked to facilitate the development of renewable energy generation for the benefit of the community. These efforts have resulted in close to 5MW of generation being

installed. Generation which will provide 20 to 30 years of cheaper, emissions free, energy supply to local enterprise and institutions.

To date Repower Shoalhaven has approached the provision of renewable energy - and the more recent associated activity to promote Electrify Everything - from a politically neutral position.

The Repower Shoalhaven Inc. committee have determined that our neutrality can no longer be sustained. As evidenced by the Climate Change Authority reports, the next parliament must act to greatly enhance emissions reduction and the transition to renewable energy.

Statements by the Liberal candidate for Gilmore, Andrew Constance, which are completely contrary to his statements post the 2019/20 fires, have given rise to grave concerns as to our future emissions trajectory and the roll of renewable generation, should the Coalition secure government.

Cost of living pressures are a major feature of the election

rhetoric. Climate Change is having a permanent and increasing impact on costs - insurance, food, taxes to pay for major event recovery etc.

The Repower Shoalhaven Inc. committee urges our members, supporters and the community at large to respond to this reality.

Vote as if your family's future depends on the outcome because it does.

When casting your votes, critically consider your preferences, prioritise consideration of how the energy policies on offer impact the economy, our security, existing/future renewable energy investments and employment. The Coalition's energy policies negatively impact all of these factors.

LIONS CLUB

GLACIERS, PENGUINS AND THE END OF THE WORLD

Patagonia - Part One By Somprom **Svinos**

A bucket-list destination for many, Patagonia—the southernmost region of Chile and Argentina-is a breathtaking landscape of snow-capped mountains, tumbling rivers, and immense ice fields.

I began in El Calafate, a town in an ancient glacial valley on the shores of Lago Argentino. Crossing the lake to Estancia Cristina, I enjoyed stunning views of the Upsala Glacier and a traditional Patagonian meal.

The next day, I visited the awe-inspiring Perito Moreno Glacier. After a boat ride across the lake, we trekked over the glacier—an unforgettable experience.

We then transferred to El Chaltén, Argentina's hiking capital, where we explored the stunning landscapes of Mount Fitz Roy, Laguna de Los Tres, and the Piedras Blancas Glacier. A rugged ride took us to Lago del Desierto, a remote lake on the Chilean border, where we cruised past hanging glaciers.

A short flight brought us to Ushuaia, the "End of the World" and gateway to Ant-

arctica. From here, we boarded the Ventas Australis, the only cruise accessing Chilean Patagonia's fjords and glaciers.

Over four days, we navigated untouched wilderness, stopping at Cape Horn, where we saw the Albatross Monument, a tribute to sailors lost in these waters. We explored massive glaciers by zodiac and visited Magdalena Island, home to a colony of Magellanic penguins.

Disembarking in Punta Arenas, we bid farewell to Patagonia's breathtaking landscapes—a truly unforgettable journey.

Lindsay got a lift to and from the ANZAC service in Ray's 05 (Peter Brock) buggy control of the Coral Sea (between Australia and New Caledonia) by establishing air bases at Port Moresby in south-eastern New Guinea and at Tulagi in the southern Solomons. But Allied intelligence learned of the Japanese plan to seize Port Moresby and alerted all available sea and air power. When the Japanese landed at Tulagi on May 3, carrier-based U.S. planes from a task force commanded by Rear Adm. Frank J. Fletcher struck the landing group, sinking one destroyer and some minesweepers and landing barges. Most of the naval units covering the main Japanese invasion force that left Rabaul, New Britain, for Port Moresby on May 4 took a circuitous route to the east, which invited a clash with Fletcher's forces.



noisseurs and home brewers. Over the last 24 months, around 47 breweries have either entered voluntary administration or entered liquidation. This is a sad situation when the people who start these breweries are usually regular people with young families who have a passion for craft beer. Many brewers start out home brewing and follow the progression, eventually moving into the craft beer scene by opening

Greeting's beer enthusiasts, beer con-

The killer in all of this is known as the 'dripping tax', worth \$6.2 billion to the federal government. With a tax that continues to rise twice a year, combined with inflation and cost of living increases, unfortunately the craft brewer doesn't stand a chance. The dripping tax needs to be turned off and our small craft breweries need to be given a proper chance to brew great beer at a reasonable price. Currently, Australia has the 3rd highest alcohol tax, accounting for 63% of what you pay per bottle of beer.

All that aside, here is a clone recipe of a golden oldie that got me excited about craft beer, many years ago:

Innes and Gunn - Scotch Ale (21L) OG: 1.082 FG: 1.012 IBU: 23 ABV: 9.2%

All Grain Ingredients

- 6.7kg Pale Ale malt 110g Chocolate malt
- 55g Peated malt
- 61g Fuggles hops (60mins)
- Irish moss or whirlfloc tablet (10
- 30g Vanilla
- 50g American oak chips
- 1pkt SafBrew US-05
- Make a 2L starter for this

Method:

Mash grain in 21.3L of treated water at 68C for 60 minutes. Mash-out at 75C and sparge with 12.8L. Remove 3L of first wort runnings and boil down to 1L on a separate stove. Bring to the boil reaming wort for 90 minutes, adding hops +30 minutes, then whirlfloc tablet with 10 mins to go.



Pour back in the reduced wort at flame out. Complete primary fermentation at 21C for 7 days. Transfer to secondary, add 30g vanilla extract and 50g American oak chips. Leave at 19C for 1 month. Rack into kegs, charge with CO2 - enjoy!

WINTER WARMER WITH A SPICY TOUCH

As skies darken and we're looking for our slippers around meal time, finding something that is new, simple, delicious and warming is a great way to prepare for the season ahead.

This is a terrific meal-in-a-tray we found in the latest Recipe Tin Eats cookbook so you can be confident it will work a treat.

The Arabic inspiration of this dish ensures you get a great dash of spice and lemon flavours while enjoying a hearty dish of chicken, spuds and carrots. We don't mind a few green beans, peas or steamed broccoli as well for added colour. Just make sure to give them a good dash of the delicious sauce this dish creates.

And try to get hold of some sumac for this dish. We can generally find it in the spice section at the supermarket. If not swap for paprika and good dash of lemon juice.

Arabic chicken and potatoes

Ingredients

- 5 x 250 g bone-in, skin-on chicken 1 tsp paprika thighs
- Extra-virgin olive oil spray, or 2 tsp extra-virgin olive oil
- into 7mm thick slices 1 bunch Dutch carrots scrubbed
- clean (10-12 carrots) or regular carrots, peeled and cut into 10cm batons about 1.5cm wide.
- 2 tbsp extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 tsp sumac powder 1 tsp cooking salt
- ½ tsp black pepper

- 1 large garlic clove, crushed using
- a garlic crusher ½ tsp dried thyme
- 1 kg potatoes, scrubbed clean, cut ½ tsp ground cumin
 - 1 tsp sumac powder
 - ½ tsp white sesame seeds 1tsp cooking salt*
 - ½ tsp black pepper
 - 3 tbsp plain yoghurt (substitute sour cream)
 - 1 tbsp extra-virgin olive oil Handful of coriander leaves or
 - parsley to serve

Method

Preheat the oven to 200°C (180°C fan-forced). Line a large baking tray with foil, then baking paper.



Place the potato and carrots in a large bowl. Drizzle with the olive oil, then sprinkle with the sumac, salt and pepper. Toss well, separating the potato slices to coat the surface of each piece. Pile onto the tray, overlapping the potato slices slightly, leaving space for the chicken.

In the same bowl add all the chicken spice paste ingredients. Mix to combine, then add the chicken and use your hands to rub the mixture into all the cracks and crevices. Nestle the chicken among the vegetables on the tray. Scrape out all the remaining paste in the bowl and dab it onto the chicken skin. Spray with the extra-virgin olive oil spray.

Bake for 45-50 minutes, rotating the tray at the halfway mark, until the chicken is deep golden.

Rest for 5 minutes on the tray, then divide the chicken, carrots and potato among plates.

Use the tray juices as the sauce. Sprinkle with coriander or parsley (if using).


